Power generated by the Project will be fed into the provincial grid via a substation located adjacent to the Hydro One Networks Inc. (HONI) transmission line which crosses the study area.

The proposed project will require approval under Ontario Regulation 359/09 (O.Reg 359/09) the Renewable Energy Approval (REA) under the *Green Energy Act*.

Kingston Solar LP had stated, on numerous occasions, its willingness to meet with your community representatives to discuss the Project and to receive comments or questions.

To date, Kingston Solar LP has not received any specific information with regard to potential adverse effects that the Project could have on the constitutional and/or treaty rights of your community. In this regard, Kingston Solar LP requests that your community provide in writing whether you have any information regarding adverse impacts that the Project may have on constitutionally protected Aboriginal or treaty rights and any measures for mitigating those adverse impacts.

Kingston Solar LP would like to follow up with you since our last letter of July 27, 2012 letter regarding Kingston Solar LP's proposal to develop the Sol-luce Kingston Solar PV Energy Project (The Project). The Project is located to the north and south of Unity Road and south of Mud Lake Road in the City of Kingston and Loyalist Township in Eastern Ontario. The proposed solar facility will have a maximum name plate capacity of approximately 100 MW AC (megawatts of alternating current). If approved, this facility would use photovoltaic (PV) technology to convert solar energy into electricity. Power generated by the Project will be fed into the provincial grid via a substation located adjacent to the Hydro One Networks Inc. (HONI) transmission line which crosses the study area.

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### **Our Efforts to Communicate with Your Community**

Over the course of the Project, Kingston Solar LP had made a number of attempts to meaningfully engage the Conseil de la Nation huronne-wendat. The following provides a list of attempts to engage your community in discussions regarding the proposed project:

- On July 28, 2011, Kingston Solar LP sent an introductory letter to your community providing an overview of the Project and indicated that Kingston Solar LP would follow-up with the Conseil de la Nation huronne-wendat to discuss how your community wishes to be engaged.
